

## Ideas for Subiaco Strategic Water Resource Precinct 24 – 25 May 2017

The Cooperative Research Centre for Water Sensitive Cities (CRCWSC) and the Water Corporation of Western Australia have partnered to deliver a workshop to identify solutions for the Subiaco Wastewater Treatment Plant odour buffer, also known as the Subiaco Strategic Water Resource Precinct. The workshop will draw on emerging science from the CRCWSC to develop an integrated approach to planning land use in the buffers of wastewater treatment plants across the Perth metropolitan area and regionally.

*The project will develop and test ideas for:*

- Identifying opportunities for synergistic and beneficial land use and infrastructure in Strategic Water Resource Precincts, focusing on Subiaco
- Developing a collaborative vision for the Strategic Water Resource Precinct

### Objectives and Outcomes

The objective of the workshop is to:

1. Develop a collaborative vision for the Subiaco Strategic Water Resource Precinct.
2. Identify land use and infrastructure opportunities to deliver this vision.

Outputs from the workshop include:

2. A pitch of Ideas to Ashleigh Vincent, General Manager Assets Planning, Water Corporation.
